## Supplies:

- Stamp Sets: Trees For Sale (159785)
- Cardstock: Tahitian Tide (159261), Basic White (159276), Parakeet Party (159259), Sweet Sorbet (159268), Daffodil Delight (119683)
- Ink: Sweet Sorbet (159216), Parakeet Party (159208), Memento Black (132708)
- Tools & Accessories: Daffodil Delight Stampin' Blends (154883), Heat Tool (129053), Snowfall Accents Puff Paint (150691), Stampin' Cut & Emboss Machine (149653), Paper Snips (103579), Stampin' Dimensionals (104430), Stampin' Seal (152813), Fine-Tip Glue Pen (138309), Tree Lot Dies\* (159938)
- DSP: Tea Boutique 6" x 6" (158659)

### Measurements:

- Card Base: Tahitian Tide 5 ½" x 8 ½", scored at 4 ¼"
- Cardstock #2: Basic White 4" x 5 ¼"
- Designer Paper: 3 ¾" x 5"

### Instructions:

- Adhere the Basic White layer and the Polka-Dot Paper to the card.
- Stamp the poles and the string lights on Basic White cardstock using the Memento black ink pad. Die-cut each with the coordinating die.
- Colour the lights with the Daffodil Delight Stampin' Blend.
- Use the Fine-Tip Glue Pen to add "bubbles" on top of each light. Let dry for 30-60 minutes before handling again.
- Adhere the poles and the 2 string lights to the card.
- Die-cut the camper with Tahitian Tide, Basic White, Basic Black and Daffodil Delight cardstock. Piece together the camper with the different coloured cardstock.
- Die-Cut the wreath using Parakeet Party and the bow using Sweet Sorbet cardstock. Adhere them to the camper.
- Adhere the camper to the card.
- Stamp the greeting on basic White cardstock using Sweet Sorbet ink. Cut out using paper Snips. Add to the card using Dimensionals.
- Stamp the detailed trees on to Parakeet Party cardstock, then die-cut using the tree die. Adhere the 2 bigger trees to the card using Seal Adhesive and the smaller one using Dimensionals.
- Add small dots of the Puff Paint to the trees and heat set using the Heat Tool until you see the paint puff up.
